**PLEASE READ THIS CAREFULLY**

### **AMENDATORY ENDORSEMENT-OKLAHOMA**

1. Under Conditions, E. Loss Payment, the first item is amended to the following:

We will give you notice that we intend to accept or deny your claim, or that we need more time to investigate your claim within 45 days after receipt of a duly executed proof of loss, unless the Insurance Commissioner has extended the deadline an additional 20 days for a weather-related catastrophe.

If we deny your claim, we will give you written notice of our denial. Our notice will identify any provision of this policy on which the denial is based.

If we need more time to investigate your claim, we will give you notice of our need for more time within 45 days after receipt of a duly executed proof of loss. Our notice will state why more time is needed.

If our investigation cannot be completed within 60 days of the date of our initial notice, we will give you written notice to state why more time is needed. We will give you such notice within 60 days of the date of our initial notice.

Except for the investigation of possible fraud or arson, which is supported by specific information, the time for investigation will not exceed 120 days unless the Insurance Commissioner has extended the deadline an additional 20 days for a weather related catastrophe.

2. Section E. Conditions, Concealment Misrepresentation or Fraud is amended to state the following:

This Coverage Form is voidable in any case of fraud, intentional concealment or misrepresentation of a material fact, by you or any other insured, at any time, concerning:

- a. This Coverage Form;
- b. The "Covered Property";
- c. Your interest in the "Covered Property";
- d. "Your Property"; or
- e. A claim under this Coverage Form.

3. *Warning: Any person who knowingly, and with intent to injure, defraud or deceive any insurer, makes any claim for the proceeds of an insurance policy containing any false, incomplete or misleading information is guilty of a felony.*
